

CHATEAU MUSAR RED 1986

Tasting Note

1986 was a difficult year - something of a drought year in the Bekaa Valley. The grapes were also difficult which proved to be a great experience in the wine-making.

Very nice cherry colour with unexpected remarkable tears. Smoky, leathery and even animal smell turning to hot chocolate and ripe fruits. Velvety in the mouth, round, full-bodied, spicy fruit with a lengthy finish.

Robe grenat tuile, d'une belle limpidite. Larme fine et reguliere. Nez sous bois, fruits noirs et rouges maceres, odeurs de romarin, thym, vegetal. Acidite rafraichissante avec en milieu de bouche un bon equilibre moelleux/acidite. Tannins tendres et finale riche.
