"Not surprisingly, Musar's white has always been out of synch with 'commercial reality' - a Mahler in a world of Richard Claydermans. A blend of the ungrafted Merwah (believed to be Semillon), a percentage of which will be barrel fermented, and tank fermented Obaideh (believed to be the ancestor of Chardonnay), this basic recipe has been tweaked recently. The unwooded 1986 is the commercial end of the spectrum, while the 1991 is the extreme - a racehorse of a wine, quivering with nervy promise, with layers of marzipan, nuts herbs and dried apricot."
