

CHATEAU MUSAR RED 1977

Tasting Note

Chateau Musar vintage which is now showing at its best. A great complex wine, which with the 1964 is my reference for character and complexity. Beautiful, mature full colour and impressive bouquet showing the whole spectrum of smells you could imagine in nature. Complex big structured body all the way through to its long finish.

Robe d'une fine etoffe rouge grenat fonce.

Nez fin et fruite, surprenant de vivacite et meme de fraicheur. Ample, subtile. Notes florales bien epanouies (jasmin, rose, pivoine).

Bouche d'attaque elegante tout en etant ferme avec des notes de terre, sous-bois, feuilles et branchages asseches.

The 1966, 1970 & 1977 were much bigger wines with a lot more tannin and backbone, very Pomerol in character (higher proportion of Cabernet Sauvignon) with much greater apparent longevity.
